

SUCCEEDING GENERATIONS (Cemetery Locations)

Location of the immigrant's grave is unknown.

1-2 The 1st and 2nd generation born in America is buried in a row with a number of Althouse burials in the Epler's Cemetery close to the Church. Next to George's grave marker is an old brown stone, weathered too much to read the inscription or cutting. Someone should enlist an expert who could possibly trace the original words which are in German. This could be the immigrant's marker.

3 - The 3rd generation born in America, my great grandfather Dan is buried at Schwartzwald and the location is described elsewhere in this genealogy. His home is secluded behind many trees with a driveway to it, from the road to Yellow House or Boyertown. It is occupied by a Dr. Desjardin.

4-5 - The 4th and 5th generations are located together in the Charles Evans Cemetery, Reading in the center of the south side or Robeson Street side.

6 - The 6th generation marker is in the St. John's (Gernant's) Cemetery in Ontelaunee Township, one mile east of Leesport, Pa. (my lot) together with my brothers Will and Sam.
